the upper levels.


2 The Charles E. Perry Building (CP), also known as Primera Casa (PC) was the first building constructed on campus, opened in 1972. Named after FIU's founding president, it currently houses the offices of our president and provost along with their support staff.

is the hub of campus activity. Here you will find campus retail, multiple dining options, and even our campus print shop. Our Disability Resource Center is located next to the piano lounge by the south entrance. GC is also home to FIU's office of Student Experiences, Student Government Association, and the food pantry. Students can be found having fun in the game room located next to Chili's or studying upstairs in one of the many study spaces.

4 The Stephen and Dorothea Green Library (GL) is one of the largest academic libraries in the Southeastern US. It contains a Starbucks, The Center for Academic Success, Writing Center, classrooms, and auditoriums. Students can be found throughout the building studying and working on group projects.

The Kissing Bridge has become a university tradition and symbol of forever love. As you cross the heart shaped lake, Deuxieme Maison (DM) can be found to the left. It is the second building constructed on campus and houses the honors college. In the center of the building, you can find the sky lounge that was created by our own landscape students.

The Steven J. Green School of International and Public Affairs (SIPA) is one of the largest schools of its kind in the world, enrolling over 7,000 students. The top ranked FIU Model UN team is



housed in these buildings alongside our international centers and institutes. The Green school is one of the only universities to host a Diplomat in Residence from the U.S. State Department.

The Wellness and Recreational Center (WRC) has multiple types of workout equipment and athletic practice spaces. There are multiple types of classes offered as well through the PantherFIT program. Students are free to use all that is offered by the WRC during their time at FIU.

3 Rafael Diaz-Balart Hall houses the FIU College of Law. While there are classrooms throughout the building, you can also find a

practice courtroom and the FIU law library. There are multiple study spaces as well as a lounge for students to spend time between classes.

① The College of Business Complex (CBC) houses professional education programs as well as MBA programs. You can find classrooms, an auditorium, meeting rooms, and mock stock market labs with access to a variety of financial databases.

Paul Cejas School of Architecture (PCA) Building was designed by worldrenowned architect Bernard Tschumi. While Standard classrooms and spaces can be found throughout the building, students can also work from assigned individual studios. Architecture students all participate in the annual competition, Walk on Water, that has them create specialized shoes to walk across the lake south of the Green Library.

11 The College of Art, Science, and Education (CASE) building houses the School of Integrated Sciences and humanity, the School of Environment, Arts, and Society, and the School of Education and Human Development.

The Academic Health Center (AHC)
Plaza is home to the College of Medicine,
the College of Nursing, and the Robert

Stempel College of Public Health and Social Work. You can find various classrooms and laboratories throughout the buildings including the Simulation Teaching and Research (STAR) Center. The STAR Center features OR, ER, and Primary Care simulation rooms.

(3) The Ronald W. Reagan Presidential House (RH) is home to the university president. While the president's main office is found in the Primera Casa Building, the presidential house is used to host special guests and events.

Museum (FROST) has over 6,000 pieces of art in the collection and is one of the largest freestanding art museums in South Florida and is an affiliate museum of the Smithsonian Institution in Washington DC. With over 80 sculptures across all campuses, FIU has the country's largest university sculpture collection.

The Herbert and Nicole Wertheim
Performing Arts Center (WPAC) houses
both the music and theatre departments.
With multiple practice rooms and
auditoriums throughout, students can be
found studying lines, music, or rehearsing
for their next performance. The school of
music makes use of a 600-seat concert
hall that houses a state-of-the-art 4,255
pipe organ.

(6) Tamiami Hall is the newest addition to university housing. While the state-of-theart building is home to students enjoying life on campus, the promenade is used for pre-game activities during the highly anticipated football season.

The **Pitbull Stadium**, also known as 'The Cage', houses a 6,500-square foot stadium club on the ground level with an upper concourse for additional fan seating, a press box, fan suites, and coach's offices.

(B) The Ocean Bank Convocation Center (OBCC), seats 5,000 people and is the site for home basketball and volleyball games. It also houses the athletic department offices, student locker rooms, and practice courts. Different events such as galas and graduation ceremonies are held here as well. At the front entrance you can find our Panther Statue, used by many as the backdrop for their graduation pictures.

The Trish and Dan Bell Chapel is currently being constructed and is set to be one of the most significant structures in the history of FIU. The chapel, a peaceful oasis from the fast pace of university life, will be a welcoming place for all faiths and for spiritual exploration.

The College of Engineering and Computing (ENG) is expanding with a state-of-the-art facility. The building will feature 120,000 square feet of makerspaces, active learning classrooms, and research laboratories.
