ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Admissions into the fully online MA program are conducted twice per year. Applicants seeking entrance for the fall term should submit materials no later than February 1. For spring term admissions, submit materials no later than September 1.



- A baccalaureate degree and a GPA of at least 3.25 (on 4.0 scale) in the last 60 semester hours of undergraduate coursework.
- GRE is not required but applicants may submit to strengthen their application.
- Two (2) letters of recommendation, a writing sample, and a 2-4 page statement of purpose describing the applicant's academic plans and long-term career goals.
- Completion of 12 semester-hours of credit (on the basis of 3-hour courses) in upper division undergraduate courses in history, or the equivalent, as approved in writing by the Graduate Program Director.
- The above admissions criteria are only minimum requirements. Applications are reviewed on a case-by-case basis.
